The Communicable Disease staff will award a plaque to the local health department with the best overall visual presentation of data. The Outstanding Poster Presentation Award will be announced on Thursday evening during the awards ceremony.

How to Apply to Present a Poster Presentation

- Contact your Regional TB or CD Nurse Consultant and indicate your interest.
- Work with your consultant to develop an abstract of the proposed poster content and submit it to the chair of the LHD Poster Presentation Committee by June 1, 2012.
- You will be notified of your acceptance by June 12, 2012.
- Develop your poster in collaboration with your consultant
- Submit completed poster design to the chair of the LHD Poster Presentation Committee by June 29, 2012

Criteria for Selection:

- Scientific content, including originality, study design and analysis;
- Public health impact; and
- Exemplification of the effective and innovative application of epidemiologic methods in an investigation or study.
